# FEDERAL BUDGET PRIORITIES 2017-18

Tourism and transport are critical pillars of the Australian economy. While significant investment has been made by the Australian Government in new tourism initiatives and public transport infrastructure, the Tourism & Transport Forum Australia believes that the 2017-18 Federal Budget must address **six key areas** to ensure that Australia doesn't fall behind in an increasingly competitive global market.

### MAINTAIN FUNDING FOR TOURISM AUSTRALIA



Funding for Tourism Australia must be maintained over the forward estimates period to ensure Australia remains a destination of choice for international visitors.

## 2 ESTABLISH A BIDDING FUND FOR BUSINESS EVENTS



Establish a \$10 million National Business Events Bid Fund to support the business events and conferences industry secure additional international events.

#### 3 INVEST IN CRITICAL TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE



Provide funding certainty for major transport projects, including Cross River Rail in Brisbane, highspeed rail between Western Sydney Airport and the Sydney CBD, and a rail link between Melbourne and Melbourne Airport.

#### 4 IMPROVE VISA COMPETITIVENESS



Increase funding for visa processing, to improve the competitiveness of visitor and working holiday visas and investigate the potential for a single visa with New Zealand for key source markets.

## SUPPORT ROLL OUT OF WI-FI AT KEY DESTINATIONS



Provide funding to deliver free high-speed Wi-Fi to ensure visitors are able to remain 'connected' when visiting Australia's iconic cities and tourist destinations.

## 6 COMMENCE IMMIGRATION PRE-CLEARANCE TRIAL



In tandem with border management technology, an immigration preclearance program should be trialled on trans-Tasman routes, enabling passengers to perform entry formalities at origin destinations.
